<u>General Rules:</u>

- 1. Entries are open to anyone. Specimens in the Horticulture Division must be grown by the exhibitor for at least 30 days and labeled as to variety. Materials in the Arrangement Division must be grown in a local garden.
- 2. No dried or artificial flowers are to be entered unless specified.
- 3. Container grown plant must have been in the possession of the exhibitor at least 3 months.
- 4. One entry per individual shall be accepted in each class in the Youth and Arrangement Divisions. More than one entry per class shall be accepted in the Horticulture Division but must be of different varieties.
- 5. Classes may be subdivided by cultivar, type, and/or color when necessary.
- 6. Entries shall be judged on merit and the decision of the judges shall be final. Only required personnel will remain in the show area during judging.

<u>Awards:</u>

- 1. If merited, one blue, one red, and one white ribbon shall be awarded in each class.
- 2. One Best in Show winner shall be selected in each Division except the Youth Division.
- Sweepstakes winners shall be selected in each Division except the Youth Division and will be determined by the greatest number of blues and if tied, greatest number of reds, and subsequently, greatest number of whites if still tied.
